**MINUTES**

A concurrent meeting of the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) Board of Directors and Live Racing Committee was held at 11:00 A.M., Tuesday, December 12, 2023. The meeting was held via teleconference originating at the CARF Office, 1776 Tribute Road, Sacramento, CA 95815.

CARF Board Directors joining by conference call: Stephen Hales, Jerome Hoban, Dan Jacobs, Tom Martinez, and Kelly Violini.

CARF Live Racing Committee members joining by conference call: Jerome Hoban and Tom Martinez.

Staff and Guests participating via conference call: Larry Swartzlander, Heather Haviland, Juliana Gomes, Tom Doutrich, Raechelle Gibbons, Ann Grottveit, Cody Boyles, Daniel Castillo, Matt Cranford, Ruben Gastelo, Tiffany Loushin, Allen Aldrich, and (510) 775-4466.

**Agenda Item 1 – Date, Time and Location of Next Meeting:** Tuesday, February 6, 2024, via teleconference.

**Agenda Item 2 – Public Comment.** None.

**Agenda Item 3 – Closed Session: Conference with Legal Counsel – Anticipated Litigation.** Mr. Hoban reported that the board had discussed with legal counsel and instructed staff to move forward with tote contract discussions for Calypso Challenge.

**Agenda Item 4 – Approval of Minutes from September 5, September 8, October 5, November 14, 2023.** {ACTION} Mr. Martinez moved to approve the CARF Board of Directors and Live Racing Committee meeting minutes from September 5, September 8, October 5, November 14, 2023 as presented. Mr. Hales seconded, unanimously approved.

**Agenda Item 5 – Report on Agency Bylaws Adopted December 1, 2023.** Ms. Haviland reported that the Agency Bylaws were approved by CARF membership mail-in vote and that the revised Bylaws are included in the packet.

**Agenda Item 6 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Legislative Program.** Mr. Boyles reported that the legislature remains in recess until January 3, 2024 and that the state budget will face an estimated \$68 billion deficit. Mr. Boyles added that public programs will be expecting heavy cuts to offset the shortfall.

**Agenda Item 7 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Calypso Challenge.** Mr. Swartzlander reported that he had received board approval to pursue contract negotiations with a new tote company and will return to the board when he receives further details.

**Agenda Item 8 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on the 2024 Budget.** Ms. Gibbons shared the 2024 CARF Agency & Live Racing Budget and highlighted several categories after discussions with the Finance Committee.

Ms. Gibbons provided a large-scale overview and noted a few changes in budget such as a Financial Review with Gilbert in 2023 will require a higher expense in 2024 for the Gilbert full audit.

{ACTION} Mr. Martinez, per recommendation and action of the CARF Finance Committee, moved to approve the 2024 CARF Agency & Live Racing Budget as presented. Mr. Hales seconded, unanimously approved.

**Agenda Item 9 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Golden Gate Fields Closure and 2024 Racing Calendar.** Mr. Swartzlander summarized that he continues to work on negotiations for the future site of Northern California racing. Mr. Swartzlander added that there is concern with Golden Gate Fields cutting purses by 25% but is hopeful that as CARF moves forward, there can be some assurance given for the future of racing in Northern California.

**Agenda Item 10 – Executive Director’s Report.** Mr. Swartzlander will be reviewing his yearly CARF Objectives and will be in contact with the Board regarding his and CARF staff employee evaluations.

Mr. Swartzlander plans to undergo medical evaluation for his heart within the week and expects to undergo a procedure sometime in the New Year.

**Summary:** Current law provides comprehensive regulation of ticket sellers and makes violations of those provisions a misdemeanor. Current law imposes various refund requirements on a ticket seller, including a requirement to issue a refund upon request to a ticket purchaser for canceled, postponed, or rescheduled events. Current law also imposes various disclosure requirements on a ticket seller, including a requirement to disclose to a purchaser the location of the seat represented by the ticket, as specified. This bill would revise and recast those provisions by expanding the definition of a ticket seller to include a primary contractor or platform, as defined, and would instead apply the refund requirement relating to the postponement or rescheduling of an event only to primary contractors. The bill would impose various disclosure requirements on ticket sellers relating to ticket price, including that the ticket seller would be prohibited from advertising, displaying, or offering a price for a ticket that does not include all fees or charges that must be paid in order to purchase the ticket other than taxes or fees imposed by a government on the transaction.

Current law requires the executive director of the commission to convene the committee, from time to time, for the purpose of discussing matters of controlled gambling regulatory policy and any other relevant gambling-related issue. This bill would increase the membership of the committee from 10 to 12 members and would require the additional members to include one representative of academia who possesses knowledge on matters related to gaming and one representative from the bureau. The bill would require the executive director to convene the committee at least twice every calendar year, rather than from time to time.

**Summary:** Current law requires a tax return filed with the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) that reports gross receipts for sales and use tax purposes to segregate the gross receipts of the seller and the sales price of the property on a line or a separate form when the

place of sale in this state or for use in this state is on or within the real property of a state-designated fair, as defined, or any real property of a state-designated fair that is leased to another party. Current law requires, on or before November 1 of each year, the CDTFA to report to the Department of Finance the amount of the total gross receipts segregated on these tax returns for the prior fiscal year, and that 3/4 of 1% of the total gross receipts be included in the next annual Governor's Budget for use by the Department of Food and Agriculture for allocation to fairs and that those funds be transferred by the Controller to the Fair and Exposition Fund, which is continuously appropriated, as prescribed. Existing law provides that certain revenues deposited into the Fair and Exposition Fund are appropriated without regard to fiscal years for allocation by the Secretary of Food and Agriculture for capital outlay to California fairs, as specified. This bill would increase the amount of the total gross receipts required to be included in the next annual Governor's Budget for use by the Department of Food and Agriculture and transferred to the Fair and Exposition Fund, as specified, from 3/4 of 1% to 3.5%. From the funds subject to allocation by the Secretary of Food and Agriculture for capital outlay to California fairs, which the bill would increase by adding this 3.5% gross receipts transfer, the bill would require, each fiscal year, the sum of \$2,500,000, or an amount equal to 5% of the fund, whichever is greater, to be paid to the department for purposes of providing administrative services to fairs, as specified.

**Summary:** Current law requires specified employees of a gambling enterprise to apply for and obtain a work permit from the California Gambling Control Commission or from a city, county, or city and county. Current law authorizes the commission to issue an order summarily suspending a person's work permit upon a finding that the suspension is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare, and provides for a hearing within 30 calendar days of the date of service of the suspension. This bill would instead provide for a hearing within 27 calendar days.
